COVID-19 Quick Hits

- Clinicians can refer patients for COVID testing at Baltimore City Testing Tents by placing a referral in CRISP. Instructions are <u>here</u>. Patients without insurance or without a Primary Care Provider can call <u>211</u> to speak with a healthcare professional. If they meet testing criteria, they can receive a referral to a testing tent.
- 2. Testing FAQ is <u>here</u>. A list of test locations can be found <u>here</u>.**Please email <u>baltimoreprovideroutreach@gmail.com</u> if there is missing testing location so we can notify the list owner**
- 3. The CDC updated its <u>priority guidance for (Nucleic Acid or Antigen) COVID-19 testing</u> and its list of potential <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>.
- 4. The CDC updated its <u>instructions</u> for symptom based strategy to discontinue isolation. The home isolation period is extended from 7 days to 10 days since symptoms first appeared for the symptom based strategy in persons with COVID-19 who have symptoms. The CDC also updated its healthcare worker <u>return to work time interval</u>.
- 5. This Wednesday (4/29), Governor Hogan issued an <u>executive order</u> requiring universal testing of all residents and staff at all Maryland nursing homes.
- 6. Last Friday (4/24), Governor Hogan released the State of Maryland's "<u>Roadmap to Recovery</u>" plan. The plan relies on four "building blocks" that must be achieved before beginning to reopen: Expanded testing capacity, increased hospital surge capacity, ramping up supply of PPE, and a robust contact tracing operation. The opening will then proceed gradually in three stages. You can read the report <u>here</u>.
- Governor Hogan <u>announced</u> two new Vehicle Emission Inspection Program (VEIP) Sites. The new locations are at the Owings Mills and Prince Frederick VEIP Sites. The sites were established, in part, due to the recently acquired tests from South Korea. There are now seven VEIP testing sites, listed below on page 2.
- 8. CareFirst BlueCross BlueShield (CareFirst) and the Maryland State Medical Society (MedChi) announced one-time \$300 grants per physician to equip practices with technology needed to provide virtual care. For more information click <u>here</u>.
- The Maryland Dept. of Aging has implemented a new statewide <u>Caregiver Service</u> <u>Corps</u> (CSC) to enable older adults to remain safely in their homes and have support systems in place to do so.
