COVID-19 Quick Hits

Baltimore City Health Department Clinician Page here |Baltimore City COVID-19 dashboard

- 1. On May 11, Baltimore City Health Department released a <u>clinician letter</u> providing greater clarity around the current pathways to provide patients COVID-19 testing.
- 2. Sign-up to <u>ImmuNet</u>, a secure web-based Maryland Department of Health registry for notification when vaccine is available
- 3. On <u>May 15</u>, the Maryland Department of Health (MDH) released a <u>clinician letter</u> to alert providers on **Multi-System Inflammatory Syndrome in Children (MIS-C)** and its potential link to COVID-19. The CDC Health Advisory on MIS-C can be found <u>here</u>. All cases of MIS-C must be reported to the Baltimore City Health Department as outlined in the MDH clinician letter.
- 4. Case investigation, contact tracing, and messaging around those activities are critical to prevent further COVID-19 transmission. Please go to the Spotlight below "What to Tell Your Patients about Contact Tracing" for more info on contact tracing in Baltimore City.
- 5. As a reminder, the Maryland Department of Aging implemented a new statewide <u>Caregiver Service Corps (CSC)</u> to enable older adults to remain safely in their homes and have the support systems to do so
 - a. If your practice identifies a senior with pressing needs with everyday tasks call **800-337-8958** to reach the CSC Call Center directly.
- 6. Check out the <u>Maryland Manufacturing Network Supplier Portal</u>, an online platform that helps connect Maryland suppliers with buyers in need of critical resources. Baltimore City residents may receive up to 30 lbs of shelf-stable food for 1 week while supplies last and will receive boxes within 3-4 days of ordering

What to Tell Your Patients about Contact Tracing

- 1. Please **provide an accurate phone number** when you get tested make sure your medical provider has an accurate phone number for you (otherwise BCHD can't reach you)
- 2. The health dept (BCHD or MDH) will call you if you test positive.
- 3. All information is confidential
- 4. If you receive a call from a number you don't recognize a few days after you got tested please **answer your phone**. It could be the health department notifying you of your testing results.
- 5. **Share your contacts with the health department.** We know it's not fun. We know it's awkward and no one wants to do it. But it's important. In order to do contact tracing we rely on to provide us with their close contacts. **Help us protect the community and your family and friends.** This is our only intervention for now we don't have a vaccine, we don't have a cure. We have contact tracing and isolation which are critical to stopping further spread of COVID-19. We need your help. We need phone numbers at the time the test is done and we need you to answer your phone and share with us the names of your close contacts.
- 6. When we reach out to the contacts, it's **confidential we don't tell them who you are.**
- 7. We notify your contacts that they might have been exposed to COVID, what symptoms to watch for, and how to quarantine safely for 14 days.

 - 1. Complete the MDH Emergency Medical Materials Request Form (link)
 - 2. Send the request form to MedResourceRequest@baltimorecity.gov
 - 3. BCHD staff will contact you directly to discuss the specifics of your request. Please allow up to 48 hours for review and processing.
 - 4. If BCHD is able to fulfill your request, you will be asked to designate a facility representative we can work with to coordinate pick-up of the supplies. Your delivery driver will be required to show a facility ID badge
